On Wednesday, the Year Sixes came to school dressed as evacuees. The children got into role as part of our Year Six project on World War Two. We started the day with practising arithmetic equations, spellings and reading. We were interrupted frequently by air - raid sirens whereby we had to get under the desks, close the blinds and put on our gas masks. We also sang World War Two songs including: 'Run Rabbit Run' and the English National Anthem. Mr Wade was extremely scary and took the role of a teacher in the 1940's quite literally! The children wrote letters home and the day concluded by watching Goodnight Mr Tom, which we have been reading and learning about in class. We had a fantastic day and we thank the parents for supporting the children with their excellent costumes!
